Avesthagen strengthens board of directors

Indian biotechnology company Avesthagen has appointed two new members to its board of directors. Joining the board are: Prof NK Ganguly, Advisor to Health Minister, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, India and Mr David Atkinson, Managing Director, Twenty Two North.

According to sources, the company will be entering into strategic partnerships by monetizing its operations at individual levels of research and development and patents. The new members on the board will play a key role in catalyzing this vision.
